

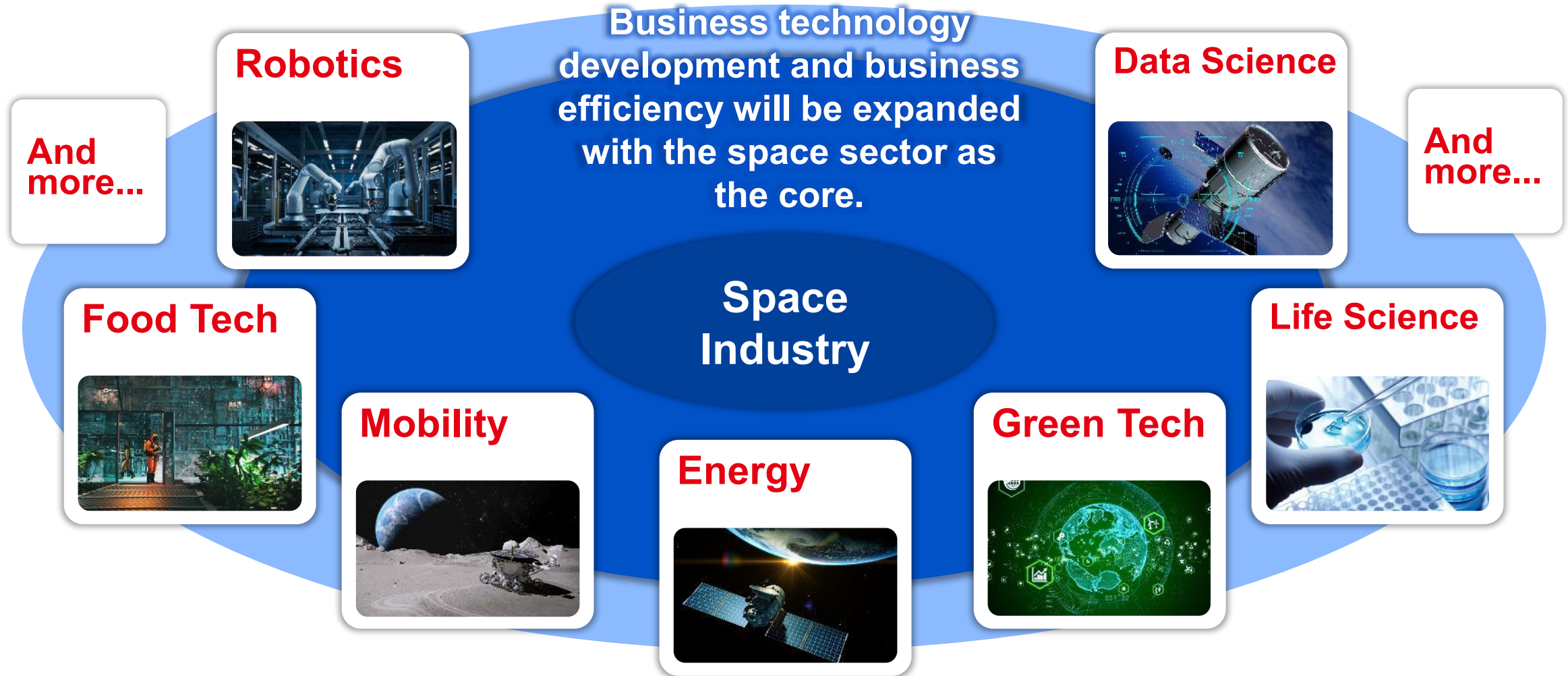

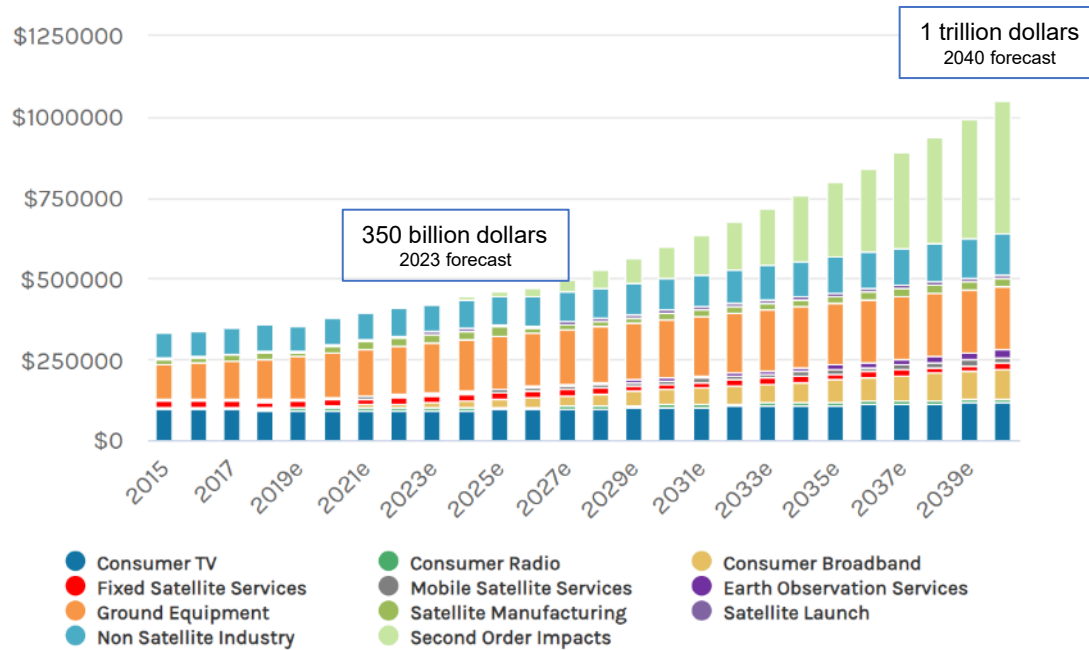
The space industry is attracting attention as an innovative field with a wide range of adjacent areas.

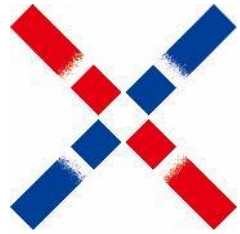
The global space business market continues to grow and is predicted to reach 150 trillion yen by 2040

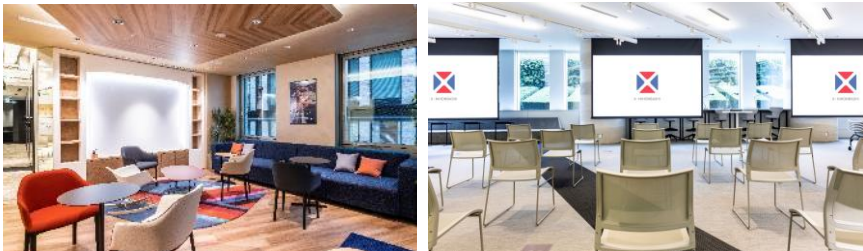

Accelerators and VCs will also gather to integrate cutting-edge technology and create a variety of businesses.

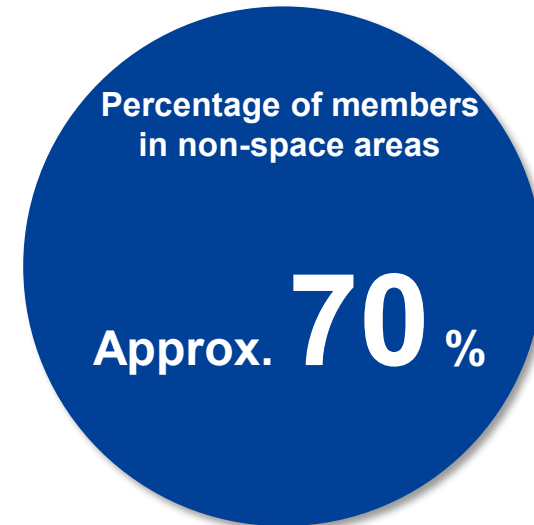

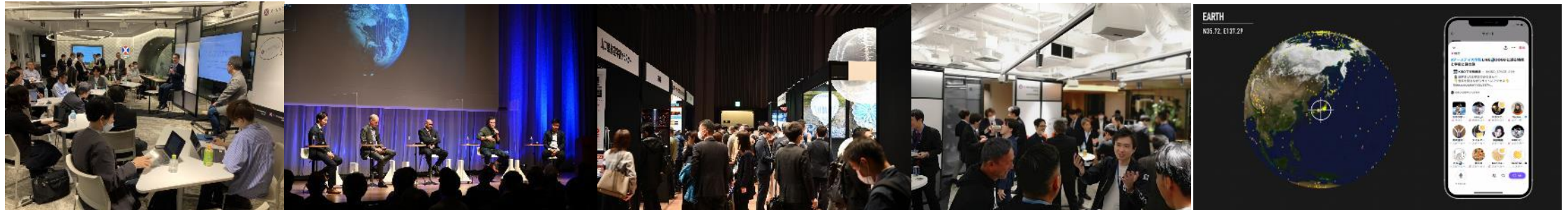
Nihonbashi is a geographically very convenient place for access to the major areas of Tokyo.

The events bring together a diverse group of companies and new business leaders seeking information and contacts to commercialize the space industry. We encourage active interaction through the use of our facilities and events.

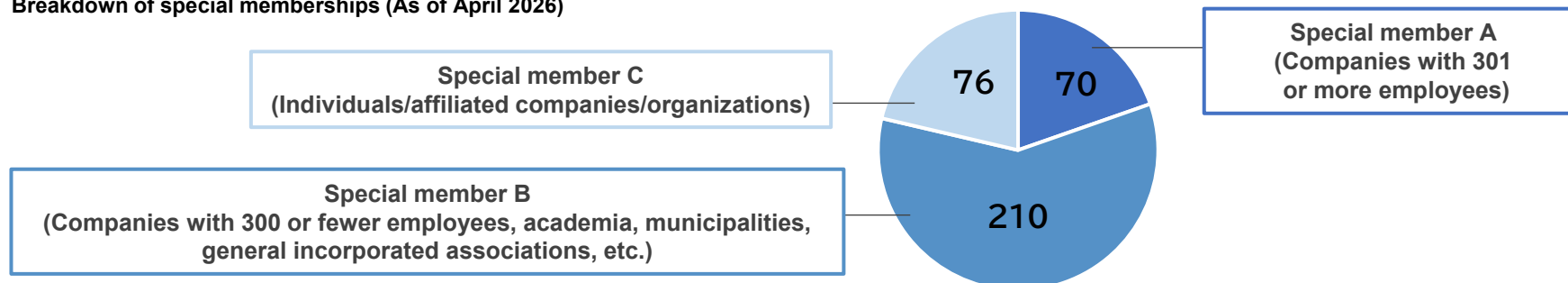

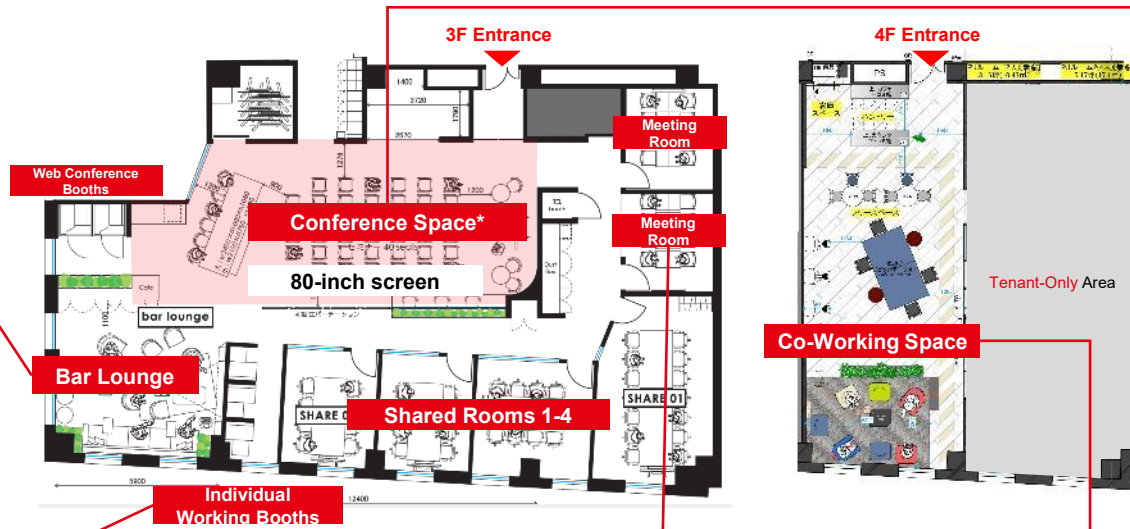




**X-NIHONBASHI BASE** is equipped with a conference space that can host events for up to 40 people and a bar lounge for networking and a variety of other uses.

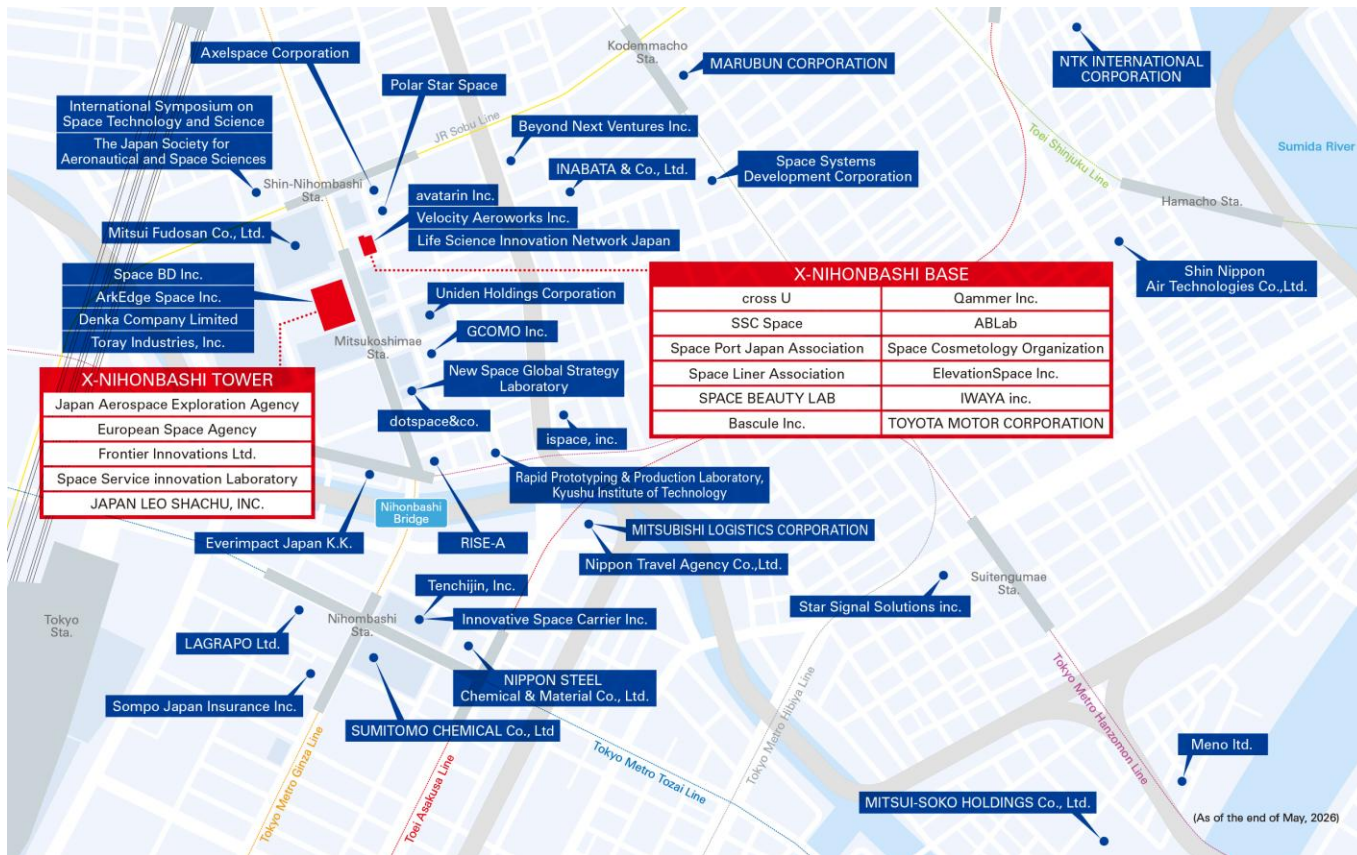

Various events and programs to promote the expansion of the space business are held about 300 times a year,\* and cooperation and co-creation among special members are actively pursued.

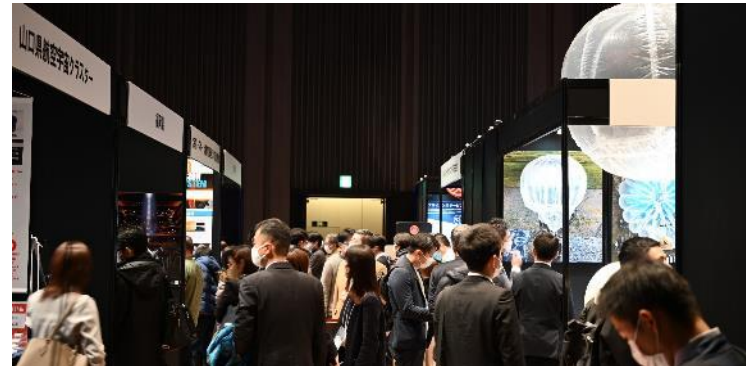

In the Nihonbashi area, where many space players are clustered together, various events are held intensively, including business exhibitions, conferences of various sizes, contests, and networking.

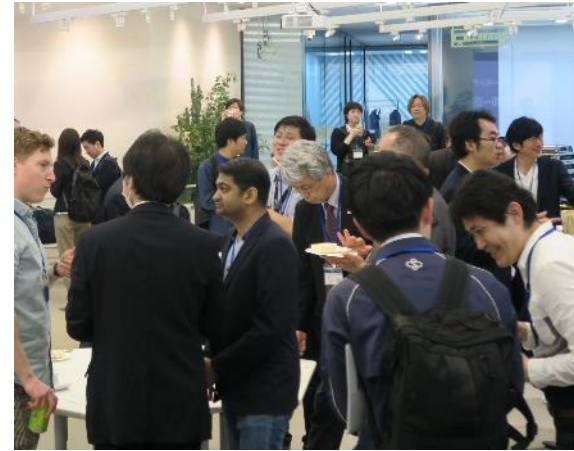
